Erasmus Studies - University of West Attica - Department of Nursing - Athens

The University of West Attica in Athens has numerous collaborations with European and International Higher Education Institutes. **The Department of Nursing** is part of the School of Health and Care Sciences. Our academic staff offer education and specialist training of high quality in the field of health care. Our four-year undergraduate program lead to registration of General Nurse. Our Department comprises of 1500 nursing students, has been an active Erasmus Partner for 40 years and runs a number of postgraduate courses. It also runs a PhD program.

Studying in Athens

The establishment of the city of Athens is lost in a mythological past. Amongst European cities, Athens is the oldest and the one with the longest history. The course of history from ancient to modern times is evident as you walk around the city; every few meters

you come across an Ancient, Roman, Byzantine or Modern monument. History is all around you and well integrated into the city's contemporary life. Athens is well known for always living up to its visitors' expectations regardless of their age and preferences.





Studying Nursing at UNIWA

Erasmus students will have the opportunity to en-



rich their nursing experience, gain insight into a different health care system and broaden their cultural awareness. Incoming students will benefit from a variety of acute and community placements in public and private Atheni-

an hospitals, and from ongoing support from teaching and nursing staff with experience in mentoring Erasmus students. Our Department has designed and successfully adopted a comprehensive study handbook (learning contracts, reflective accounts) for optimising student experience. All students are allocated student buddies for support in the start of their program.

COURSES

We offer clinical training in English but only up to 8 weeks due to limited availability of suitable clinical placements for Erasmus students [in English]. Since 2023 we also offer theoretical courses in English to incoming students:

Fall semester-courses & ECTS

- 1.Clinical Nursing I (internship up to 8 weeks) 12 ECTS, or Clinical Nursing II (internship up to 8 weeks + essay) 18 ECTS
- 2. Family nursing Theory 2 ECTS
- 3. Nephrology nursing Theory 2 ECTS
- 4.Writing an academic paper Theory and Laboratory 4 ECTS

Spring semester—courses & ECTS

- 1.Clinical Nursing I (internship up to 8 weeks) 12 ECTS, or Clinical Nursing II (internship up to 8 weeks + essay) 18 ECTS
- 2. Sociology of health and illness Theory 2 ECTS
- 3.Communication skills interpersonal relationships in nursing Theory 2 ECTS
- 4. Health economics Theory 2 ECTS
- 5. Home care nursing Theory 2 ECTS
- 6.Addiction nursing Theory 2 ECTS
- 7. Transcultural Nursing Theory 2 ECTS

Each theory course [2 credits] is 39 hours, and is delivered as a combination of lectures [minimum 20 taught hrs] and project work/ tasks.

Courses will be delivered in a period of maximum of 2,5 to 3 months, so students can complete the course within a 3 month mobility.

Students will obtain a grade following an exam or project assignment.

Clinical Training (internship) is offered depending on the availability of suitable placements.

Suggested specialities in clinical training: Medical & Surgical Nursing, Critical Care, Emergency, Perioperative, Coronary and Cardiac Care, Operating Theatres, Community Nursing, Home Care Nursing, Mental Health, and Paediatrics.
